



During the month of June we remember several different saints. St. Peter, who was with Jesus from the very start and, although he denied he knew Jesus after his arrest, still Jesus chose him to be the rock on which the Christian Church was to be founded.



St. Paul, who only met the Risen Jesus, we have to thank for taking the Gospel to non-Jews, the Gentiles, which of course includes us.

But the one I want to focus on is St. Barnabas. 'The man with the biggest heart in the Church' is how William Barclay described Barnabas. That makes Barnabas one of the greatest 'mirrors' of God - for our God has the biggest heart in the whole universe!

Barnabas is the sort of person you love having in a church - or anywhere. Perhaps his Christian friends paid him the greatest compliment by giving him a new name. Instead of Joseph, which is what his mother called him, they named him Barnabas, 'son of encouragement'.

People like Barnabas who encourage others rather than criticize. It is tragic that Christians often criticize rather than show love. How do we shape up to the example of Barnabas? Do we encourage those around us? Do we show them God's love? Let's make it our prayer that we do both at all times and in all our meetings with others.

From The Musicians' Gallery...

I wonder if anybody else heard the recent radio discussion concerning concerts held in prisons. We're quite used to concerts everywhere - halls, churches, inside, outside etc - but in gaol? Apparently, it is something which has been tried a little and the outcome has been quite surprising. It's not difficult to realise that allowing a number of violent offenders and other inmates to come together in a large space all at the same time would probably cause a riot or worse, but strangely, in the two or three prisons where a concert has been given, it produced an amazing result. One of the people on the radio programme had spent some time in a prison where a concert had been given by a pop-singer-guitarist and both the singer and the ex-prisoner were amazed at the quiet and responsive attitude of the audience.

Music can reach the very depths of the soul where even words cannot reach. And hearing music in prison allowed the in-mates a space in which to acknowledge their own emotions in a way which, in a place having no personal emotional space and considerable noise to contend with, negated that in the daily run of life.

The French composer - and organist - Olivier Messaien (1908 - 1992) wrote a lot of music incorporating his love of birdsong, which gives some of his music an ethereal sound. His use of harmonies and keys comprises a very 20th century sound of which many say 'You either love his music or hate it!' He wrote "Quatuor pour la fin temps" (Quartet for the end of time) while he was a prisoner of war, making use of instruments which were available at the time. A concert of this work given in a prison fairly recently, met with great acclaim. Was that because he was writing from the depths of his soul while he himself was in prison? Apparently, there is much in the piece that could and did, reach into the very being of the inmates who heard it.

We pray that those who were and are today, moved by music may come to realise that music isn't just a lot of notes - even if, as Eric Morecambe famously said, 'They're all there but not necessarily in the right order!' Music has much more to say - it can soothe, heal, excite, change us and so on. The list is endless. And even at surface level it can be enjoyed as it is - and why not! - but like most things the more we put in, that is, actually listen, to the music, the more we get from it

Pentecost - Sunday 9th June 2019



Pentecost is the annual Christian festival commemorating the descent of the Holy Spirit on the disciples of Jesus after his ascension from earth to heaven on Ascension Day. It always falls on the seventh Sunday after Easter. Pentecost means "fiftieth day", as it is celebrated on Pentecost Sunday, the 50th day of the Easter season (including Easter Sunday, the first day, in the counting). It is also known as Whit Sunday, Whitsun, or Whit, meaning "White Sunday", a name derived from the white garments that were worn by those newly baptized on this day. Pentecost is regarded as the birthday of the Christian church, and the start of the church's mission to the world.

"Reflections" is an informal short church service that is open to everybody. It is a light hearted service with upbeat hymns and readings. A chance to reflect and pray.


It is held at St. Mary's Church, Hobs Meadow on the first Tuesday of every month, starting at 11.30 am.

2 teaspoons bicarbonate of soda


1 egg (beaten)


“Saint of the Month” - June

Saint Petroc

Saint Petroc or Petrock, died circa 564 and was a British prince and Christian saint, and is remembered on 4th June.

Probably born in South Wales, he primarily ministered to the Britons of Devon (Dewnans) and Cornwall (Kernow), where he is associated with a monastery at Padstow, which is named after him (Pedroc-stowe, or 'Petrock's Place'). Padstow appears to have been his earliest major cult centre, but Bodmin became the major centre for his veneration when his relics were moved to the monastery there in the later ninth century. Bodmin monastery became one of the wealthiest Cornish foundations by the eleventh century. There is a second ancient dedication to him nearby at Little Petherick or "Saint Petroc Minor".

In Devon ancient dedications total a probable seventeen (plus Timberscombe just over the border in Somerset), mostly coastal and including one within the old Roman walls of Exeter as well as the villages of Petrockstowe and Newton St Petroc. In Wales his name is commemorated at St Petrox near Pembroke, Ferwig near Cardigan and Llanbedrog on the Llŷn peninsula. He also became a popular saint in Brittany by the end of the tenth century.

Making a difference in Lyndon

The school half-term holidays are over, our Year 6 kids have hopefully got over their key stage 2 SATs, and summer is definitely around the corner! So, what’s happening in Lyndon this month?

Well, our good friends at the Hobs Moat Community Café are busier than ever. If you haven’t been there yet, why not drop by? The Hobs Moat Community Café meets every Thursday from 12 till 2 pm at St. Mary’s Church Hall. You can have a chat with friends and neighbours, have a bite to eat and a drink, pick up a bag of groceries and “pay what you feel”, either in cash or in kind, by giving your time to help with the running of the cafe itself. All the food etc. is donated by supermarkets and would otherwise go to landfill, a terrible waste.

Alongside their usual activities, the café will be holding some special events in June. ‘Grown in town’ are coming to St Mary’s on **Thursday 30th May** and **6th June** at 1pm to share some gardening basics in a free workshop. They will be talking about seeds, soil, pots, potting on and pricking out, and propagation. Get your gardening skills ready for the coming growing season. Be ready to get your hands dirty! This is followed on **Thursday 20th June** by free First Aid training, a skill we should all have, especially those of us with young children, grandchildren and ageing parents i.e. everybody!

Whilst the first cuckoo heralds the start of spring (and these days you’d be very lucky to actually see or hear one), summer is the season of garden parties and fetes.

One event that we will be supporting (it’s a very worthy cause) is the annual Friends of Solihull Hospital (FOSH) summer fete on **Saturday 1st June**. FOSH is a charity run solely by volunteers to raise funds for

Solihull Hospital. It was formed in 1953 and is still run today by a hard-working band of volunteers (probably not too many of the original ones, though). Each year the fete raises money to help boost funds for the group who buy the hospital much-needed and life-saving equipment.

There will be plenty to see and do from 1pm until 5pm, its fun for all the family, with lots of local entertainment, plenty of stalls including a raffle. A brilliant way to round off the half term break!

There is a small admission charge for adults, admission is free for accompanied children, staff and patients. There is also free onsite parking while at the fete.

Finally, just a reminder that our next Lyndon Residents meeting is at the Guides Hut on Brackleys Way on **Thursday 18th July**, starting at 7pm. This is our Annual General Meeting at which we appoint new members to our committee. Again, everyone is welcome, so come along and find out what is happening in Lyndon and have your say on the issues that affect **you**. 

Stage View Drama Group



Stage View is a drama group who meet every Wednesday at Hi Bri's dance studio on Stratford Rd, Shirley, just behind the Aldi store, close to the entrance of Shirley Park. At present the group consists of 11 cast members, all of whom have varying levels of disabilities, the group aims to produce two productions a year, one in the summer and then a Christmas pantomime style production.

Throughout the year we rehearse each week to achieve this. During rehearsals we have combined many different techniques to facilitate our end result, these include confidence building activities and mindfulness meditation, which encourages relaxation and patience during rehearsals. We also include a show and tell exercise at the start of the day; this encourages the cast to speak out in front of others. The group uses music, dance and narration to express themselves which also enables those with the lowest of confidence to be able to participate and perform in front of an audience.

The sessions run from 10 am till 3 pm and the cost for each session is £5 with refreshments available for 50p.


